

## #gradflock Kudos

On September 18, 2024, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the winners and honorable mention for the 11th annual Campus RainWorks Challenge, a national competition that engages college students in the design of green infrastructure solutions to address stormwater pollution.



The winning team, an interdisciplinary group from the UO, integrated stormwater management and nature play into a K-8 school campus and included rain gardens, bioswales, a dry-creek infiltration trench, and more.
