

601 Research: [Topic]	
	UO Catalog definition: Disciplined inquiry of a topic with varying techniques and assignments suited to the nature and conditions of the problem being investigated. Often pursued in relation to a dissertation or thesis.
	Example for why a student might register for 601: Research - Students are required to engage in specific research methods to further their individual research and professional interests prior to, or concurrently with, their thesis/dissertation pursuits.
	Guidance:
	Program has documented policies and procedures for enrolling in this type of credit.
	Instructor and student complete an individualized course plan that documents activity completion expectations for the term. Example plan attached. The individualized course plan is approved by the instructor and reviewed and approved following the Unit's internal governance procedures for curricular review.
	Student engagement involves the conduct of research activities under the supervision of a UO faculty member or program-approved research supervisor.
	Student engagement is in line with university SEI expectations, i.e., 40 hours of engagement per credit
604/704 Internship: [Topic]	
	Proposed UO Catalog definition: Paid or unpaid professional practice in an organization that integrates concepts studied at the university with career-related work experience.
	Example for why a student might register for 604/704: Internship - Internships are required by several graduate programs and their licensing bodies. Internships vary by setting, skills expected to obtain, and population.
	Guidance:
	Program has documented policies and procedures for enrolling in this type of credit.
	Experience is supervised and evaluated directly by a qualified person in the internship setting and in coordination/communication with a UO faculty member. UO faculty member serves as instructor of record.
	Program has documented internship policies and procedures, and requires an internship agreement or contract between the student and the organization where the student is completing the internship. The internship placement site and experience structure must be reviewed and approved following the Unit's internal governance procedures for curricular review. The internship agreement/contract must be reviewed and approved by the academic program director or designated faculty.
	Program has documented procedures in place for formal evaluation of students' engagement and performance in the internship experience as well as for how the student will seek support if there are challenges at the internship site.
	Student engagement is in line with university SEI expectations, i.e., 40 hours of engagement per credit
605/705 Reading and Conference: [Topic] or Special Problems: [Topic]	
	UO catalog definition for Reading and Conference: A particular selection of material read by a student and discussed in conference with a faculty member.
	UO catalog definition for Special Problems: Specialized inquiry into a particular topic by a student and discussed with a faculty member.
	Example for why a student might register for 605/705: Reading and Conference - A student may be preparing for required prelim exams that require extensive amounts of reading designed to deepen the specific interests of the student. Academic programs may want the student to receive course credit for this effort and the resulting academic products.
	Guidance:
	Program has documented policies and procedures for enrolling in this type of credit.
	Instructor and student complete an individualized course plan that documents activity completion expectations for the term. Example plan attached. The individualized course plan is approved by the instructor reviewed and approved following the Unit's internal governance procedures for curricular review.
	Student engagement involves assignment of specific readings and discussion of those readings via one-on-one meetings with instructor-of-record.
	Student engagement is in line with university SEI expectations, i.e., 40 hours of engagement per credit

606/706 Practicum: [Topic] or Field Studies: [Topic]	
	UO catalog definition for Practicum: A series of clinical experiences under academic supervision designed to integrate theory and principles with practice.
	UO catalog definition for Field Studies: A series of practical experiences on or off campus to understand principles or develop skills in performing selected tasks.
	Example for why a student might register for 606/706: Practicum - Several accreditation and licensure bodies require students to gain supervised practice experiences, and those experiences can be varied in terms of setting
	Guidance:
	Program has documented policies and procedures for enrolling in this type of credit.
	Experience is supervised and evaluated by UO faculty member in coordination with personnel in the setting where student is gaining experience. UO faculty member serves as instructor of record for the credits.
	Program has documented practicum or field studies policies and procedures, and requires a practicum or field studies agreement or contract between the student and the organization where the student is completing the practicum/ field study. The practicum/ field study placement site and experience structure must be reviewed and approved following the Unit's internal governance procedures for curricular review. The practicum/field study agreement/contract must be reviewed and approved by the academic program director or designated faculty.
	Student engagement is in line with university SEI expectations, i.e., 40 hours of engagement per credit
