Common Oregon transportation laws

- Seatbelts or safety restraints are required for all passengers.
- If you are [traveling with children](#) at least 6 years old or weighing less than 60 lbs., they must be in a safety seat or booster seat.
- You may drive in Oregon for one year using a driver's license from your home country and an International Driver's Permit (IDP). Your home country issues your IDP before arriving in the United States.
